Background:

In conjunction with the development of Grand Heritage Traditions development and in accordance with Ordinance No. 2004-09-05 (PD – Grand Heritage), Mario Sinacola Inc. has submitted an application for a specific use permit for a batch plant for construction of the development's streets and infrastructure. Additionally, the applicant will improve a portion of Geren Drive as a part of this project.

Appropriate notice was published and neighbor notices were provided to owners of property within 200 feet of the site. No indications of opposition have been received.

On June 28, 2016, the Planning & Zoning Commission was scheduled to conduct a public hearing and make a recommendation on the application; however, the meeting was cancelled due to the lack of a quorum. The Commission is scheduled to meet on July 5, 2016 prior to the City Council meeting in order to consider the application. Revised notice was posted and mailed.

Potential conditions for the SUP might include:

- · duration: earlier of 18 months or project completion
- · dust control
- · traffic control and signage
- · times of operation seven days/week 6am-7pm

Specific Use Permit – Concrete Batch Plant

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LAVON, TEXAS, AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES TO GRANT A SPECIFIC USE PERMIT FOR CONSTRUCTION OF A TEMPORAY CONCRETE BATCH PLANT; PROVIDING SEVERABILITY AND CUMULATIVE CLAUSES; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City of Lavon recognizes the need for ongoing development of the City, and that because of such development, an amendment of the zoning ordinance may occasionally be required; and

WHEREAS, the City of Lavon has received an application for a specific use permit to construct a temporary concrete batch plant on a tract of land situated in Tract 119, ABS A0002, Drury Anglin Survey and located approximately 475 feet south of Windmill Drive and 1500 feet east of County Road 484 for Traditions at Grand Heritage; and

WHEREAS, the Planning and Zoning Commission and the governing body of the City of Lavon, Texas, in compliance with the laws of the State of Texas and the ordinances of the City of Lavon, have given the requisite notices by publication and otherwise, and have held public hearings and afforded a full and fair hearing to all property owners generally, and to all persons interested in and situated in the affected area and in the vicinity thereof, the governing body in the exercise of its legislative discretion has concluded that the City of Lavon Code of Ordinances be amended as follows:

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LAVON, TEXAS THAT:

SECTION 1. Findings.

It is hereby officially determined that the findings and recitations contained above in the preamble of this ordinance are true and correct and are incorporated herein by reference.

SECTION 2. Authorization.

- A. That the City of Lavon Code of Ordinances, Zoning Code, Ord. No. 2004-09-05, as heretofore amended, and the same is hereby amended so as grant a Specific Use Permit on the property described herein to permit construction of a temporary concrete batch plant for the purpose of constructing infrastructure within the development and constructing, repairing, or reconstructing public infrastructure within the vicinity of the development as approved by the Director of Public Works.
- B. That the time period for the Specific Use Permit shall be the earlier of eighteen (18) months from the effective date or the City's final acceptance of the improvements.

- D. That an advance traffic control plan and warning signs shall be in place at all times.
- E. That the plant hour of operations shall be limited to 6:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. seven days per week.

SECTION 3. Severability Clause.

It is hereby declared by the City Council that if any of the sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses, phrases, words, or provisions of this ordinance should be declared unconstitutional or otherwise invalid for any reason, such event shall not affect any remaining sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses, phrases, words, or provisions of this ordinance.

SECTION 4. Cumulative Clause.

This ordinance shall be cumulative of all provisions of ordinances of the City except where the provisions of this ordinance are in direct conflict with the provisions of such ordinances, in which event the conflicting provisions of such ordinances are hereby repealed.

SECTION 5. Public Meeting.

It is hereby officially found and determined that the meeting at which this ordinance was passed was open to the public as required by law.

SECTION 6. Effective Date.

This ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage and approval by the City Council.

Background:

Over the years, Collin County residents have voted for bond funding for parks and open spaces throughout the county. Upon application, the county provides financial assistance to cities and non-profit organizations for eligible projects. The most recent bond program provides matching funds through 2016. The City of Lavon has applied for and received matching funds for the acquisition of park land as well as park improvements.

At the June 13, 2016 meeting, the Park Board voted unanimously to recommend that the City Council submit two applications for projects in this funding cycle. The application deadline is July 11.

In conjunction with the application process, the City is required to submit a resolution of support for the application. A resolution has been prepared and is submitted for City Council consideration.

Collin County Parks and Open Space Project Funding Assistance Program Application #1

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LAVON, TEXAS DESIGNATING CERTAIN OFFICIALS AS BEING RESPONSIBLE FOR, ACTING FOR AND ON BEHALF OF THE CITY IN DEALING WITH COLLIN COUNTY, HEREIN REFERRED TO AS THE "COUNTY", FOR THE PURPOSE OF PARTICIPATING IN THE COLLIN COUNTY PARKS & OPEN SPACE PROJECT FUNDING ASSISTANCE PROGRAM, HEREINAFTER REFERRED TO AS THE "PROGRAM"; CERTIFYING THAT THE CITY IS ELIGIBLE TO RECEIVE PROGRAM ASSISTANCE; CERTIFYING THAT THE CITY MATCHING SHARE IS READILY AVAILABLE; AND DEDICATING THE PROPOSED LAVON AREA COMMUNITY SPORTS PARK LAND EXPANSION FOR PUBLIC RECREATIONAL USES.

- WHEREAS, the City Council recognizes the need for and benefits of developing parks and open space throughout the City; and
- WHEREAS, the City is fully eligible to receive financial assistance under the Program; and
- WHEREAS, the City Council desires to authorize an official to represent and act for the City of Lavon in relation to the Program.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LAVON, TEXAS, THAT:

- SECTION 1. The City Council hereby certifies that the City is eligible to receive assistance under the program and that notice of the application has been appropriately posted.
- **SECTION 2**. The City Council hereby certifies that the matching share for this application is readily available at this time.
- SECTION 3. The City Council hereby designates, authorizes and directs the City Secretary to make application and act for the City of Lavon in dealing with the County for the purpose of participating in the Program for the acquisition of property.
- SECTION 4. The City of Lavon dedicates the acquired land and/or improvements for the Lavon Area Community Sports Park Land Expansion as identified in the application for public recreational use and commits to maintain the property and/or improvements.



Collin County > Parks & Open Space > Project Funding Assistance Program

Project Funding Assistance Program

The Project Funding Assistance Program has been in place since 1999 when the citizens approved a \$5.75 million bond proposition for Parks and Open Space. Those funds were used to create Collin County's Parks and Open Space Strategic Plan and assisted with the advancement of 33 projects for twenty-five different entitles over a 3-year period. In 2003, the citizens approved an \$11 million bond proposition that allowed



us to expand an already successful program. The 2003 funds supported the development of 45 projects for twenty-nine different entities over a 5-year period.

In November 2007, the citizens of Collin County approved a \$17 million bond proposition for Parks and Open Space. Over the next six years (2009-2016) Collin County will make these funds accessible to cities and non-profit organizations within the County. These funds will be obtainable through an application process to assist with the acquisition of park land, trail construction and park/open space improvements.

The Collin County Parks Foundation Advisory Board administers the Project Funding Assistance Program. This is a <u>re-limbursement</u> program. Applicants must have at minimum dollar for dollar in matching funds, comprised of direct cash or In-kind services, for the project being proposed.

Eligible applicants must be 501(c)(3) tax-exempt organization, nonpolitical groups, or any unit of local government including municipalities, school districts, or county located in Collin County, Texas. Faith-based organizations are eligible to apply as long as inherently religious activities, such as worship and religious instruction are not conducted.

Proposed project goals must be similar to and support or advance the mission published in the *Collin County Parks and Open Space Strategic Plan (October 2001)*. The executive summary of this plan is made available on the Collin County website or you may request a complete copy by emailing openspace@collincountytexas.gov.

Information regarding the Project Funding Assistance Program is presented in the General Guidelines and Instructions. The Funding Application* is now a fillable form.

The application submission deadline is Monday, July 11, 2016, with the award announcement in October. An original and 12 copies of your application packet should be submitted to Collin County Special Projects, 4690 Community Avenue, Suite 200, McKinney, Texas 75071. For expediency please staple upper left corner on ALL packets of Information submitted.


The City seeks matching grant funding for the purchase of the four parcels of land.

CITY OF LAVON, TEXAS ORDINANCE NO. 2016-07-01

Specific Use Permit – Concrete Batch Plant

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LAVON, TEXAS, AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES TO GRANT A SPECIFIC USE PERMIT FOR CONSTRUCTION OF A TEMPORAY CONCRETE BATCH PLANT; PROVIDING SEVERABILITY AND CUMULATIVE CLAUSES; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City of Lavon recognizes the need for ongoing development of the City, and that because of such development, an amendment the zoning ordinance may occasionally be required; and

WHEREAS, the City of Lavon has received an application for a specific use permit to construct a temporary concrete batch plant on a tract of land situated in Tract 119, ABS A0002, Drury Anglin Survey and located approximately 475 feet south of Windmill Drive and 1500 feet east of County Road 484 for Traditions at Grand Heritage; and

WHEREAS, the Planning and Zoning Commission and the governing body of the City of Lavon, Texas, in compliance with the laws of the State of Texas and the ordinances of the City of Lavon, have given the requisite notices by publication and otherwise, and have held public hearings and afforded a full and fair hearing to all property owners generally, and to all persons interested in and situated in the affected area and in the vicinity thereof, the governing body in the exercise of its legislative discretion has concluded that the City of Lavon Code of Ordinances be amended as follows:

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF HEATH, TEXAS THAT:

SECTION 1. Findings.

It is hereby officially determined that the findings and recitations contained above in the preamble of this ordinance are true and correct and are incorporated herein by reference.

SECTION 2. Authorization.

- A. That the City of Lavon Code of Ordinances as heretofore amended, and the same is hereby amended so as grant a Specific Use Permit on the property described herein to permit construction of a temporary concrete batch plant.
- B. That the time period for the Specific Use Permit shall be the earlier of eighteen (18) months from the effective date or the City's final acceptance of the improvements.
- C. That the applicant shall proactively maintain dust control related to batch plant operations at all times.

- D. That an advance traffic control plan and warning signs shall be in place at all times.
- E. That the plant hour of operations shall be limited to 6:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. seven days per week.

SECTION 3. Severability Clause.

It is hereby declared by the City Council that if any of the sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses, phrases, words, or provisions of this ordinance should be declared unconstitutional or otherwise invalid for any reason, such event shall not affect any remaining sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses, phrases, words, or provisions of this ordinance.

SECTION 4. Cumulative Clause.

This ordinance shall be cumulative of all provisions of ordinances of the City except where the provisions of this ordinance are in direct conflict with the provisions of such ordinances, in which event the conflicting provisions of such ordinances are hereby repealed.

SECTION 5. Public Meeting.

It is hereby officially found and determined that the meeting at which this ordinance was passed was open to the public as required by law.

SECTION 6. Effective Date.

This ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage and approval by the City Council.
