#### PUBLIC SERVICE ANNOUNCEMENT

#### **Election to Continue Existing Street Maintenance Funding**

Since 2003, Lavon voters have voted yes for the street maintenance sales tax.

By law, this  $\frac{1}{2}$  ¢ sales tax collected from all who shop in Lavon, residents and non-residents alike, can only be used for the "maintenance and repair of municipal streets" and must be reauthorized by voters every four years. If Lavon voters do not vote yes, other entities outside the city, like the county, can hold an election and increase the sales tax in Lavon for their purposes.

On Saturday, May 1, 2021, an election for the reauthorization of the sales tax dedicated to maintaining the city street network will be held. Early voting begins at Lavon City Hall on April 19.

Discussion and action regarding the Capital Improvements Plan.

#### Background:

On August 4, 2020, the City Council approved the 2020-2025 Capital Improvements Plan (CIP). A fundamental characteristic of the CIP is that it is an ever-evolving tool that requires regular assessment to maintain its relevance. The city engineer has provided quarterly CIP status reports to inform the City Council of project status and development plans. Historic background and supporting information regarding the CIP that provide context include:

#### Community Vision Assessment

In the Community Engagement Feedback Takeaways, a key feedback takeaway from the planning process includes *City Services & Infrastructure*..." prioritize improvements to the city's streets, mobility, and drainage infrastructure and would like to see an increased investment in parks, community facilities, and code enforcement." (CVA, p.9)

#### 2019-21 Strategic Plan

The Core Purpose includes a purpose statement, "Serve as stewards of planning, infrastructure, and investment" (CVA, p.11). The second Core Value identifies "Safety – We believe that providing a safe community, with high quality infrastructure and services, is one of the primary purposes of our city government and maintaining safety as a strength of Lavon is extremely important (CVA, p. 11). Among Two-Year Goals, the second goal is, "Research Pricing and Prepare a Scope for a Capital improvements Program (CIP)." (CVA, p.13) The specific Goal 2 description states that a "CIP can include items such as:

- Infrastructure (including Drainage and Storm Sewer, Sidewalks, and Trails.
- Streets/ Mobility
- City Facilities & Amenities (Including Parks)" (CVA, 14)

In advance of the FY 2021-22 budget preparation, the CIP is scheduled to be reviewed and adjusted as needed.

The city engineer will lead the work session.

A. Public hearing, discussion, and action regarding the application of Todd Stern, TSHH, LLC to amend Ordinance No. 2019-07-04 that established the LakePointe Planned Development, Exhibit 6 Residential Planning Area Building Standards, Sections 1(a) and 1(d) to add an option for 5.25" (4" reveal) smooth cementitious horizontal siding and related illustrations to Exhibit #6A.

Presentation of request.

City Administrator Kim Dobbs provided information regarding the application. Todd Stern, TSHH, LLC provided information regarding the requested change to the LakePointe Planned Development (PD).

#### PUBLIC HEARING, to receive comments regarding the request.

Mayor Sanson opened the public hearing at 7:22 p.m. and invited comments for or against the proposed request. There being no comments, Mayor Sanson closed the hearing at 7:23 p.m.

Ms. Dobbs summarized prior activity regarding the request. Fire Chief Danny Anthony and David Petricca, Metro Fire provided information regarding the fire engine and additional equipment offered.

MOTION: APPROVE AND AUTHORIZE THE PURCHASE OF A FIRE ENGINE FOR \$950,000 AND RELATED EQUIPMENT FOR \$50,000 WITH FUNDS FROM THE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS PLAN SERIES 2020 CERTIFICATES OF OBLIGATION.

D. Discussion regarding the improved Building Code Effectiveness Grading Classification received form the Insurance Service Office (ISO).

Ms. Dobbs provided information regarding the improved rating from a 5 to a 4 and commended Building Inspector Wes Caperton and Municipal Services Coordinator LeAnn McClendon.

E. Discussion and action regarding the Public Utility Commission of Texas inquiry relating to the 2021 consumer price index (CPI) adjustment to municipal telecommunications right-of-way access lines rates.

Ms. Dobbs provided information regarding the right-of-way access lines rates. No action was taken

F. Discussion and action regarding orders and regulations, programming, city facilities and operations related to COVID-19.

The City Council discussed state orders and plans for adjusting the conduct of city operations. Specifically, the City Council directed: after the current pay period, discontinue public safety hazard pay that has been paid since March 2020; continue weekend fire stipend-shifts; discontinue the suspension of disconnection for delinquent utility accounts with appropriate notifications; adjust remote work as normal schedule with flexible modifications at directors' discretion; increase cleaning of city hall facilities once the doors are unlocked; resume in-person meetings with appropriate spacing measures; cancel Camp 9-1-1 as many partners are not participating yet; open the doors of city hall with the installation of proper permanent protections; request masks be worn in city hall and required at municipal court and continue the suspension of facility rentals. The Council concurred with Police Chief Jones' suggestion that due to the limited lobby area, Police Department/Municipal Court office access continue to be managed with controlled entry and buzzer. The Council directed staff to continue researching ways to encourage residents to conduct business online whenever possible.

G. Discussion and action regarding Board and Commission appointments – Planning and Zoning Commission and Lavon Economic Development Corporation Board of Directors.

Ms. Dobbs noted the vacancies. No action was taken.

#### FACILITIES DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT

#### FACILITIES DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT

#### RECITALS

WHEREAS, the City is a general law municipal corporation duly organized and validly existing under the laws of the State of Texas within Collin County, Texas; and

WHEREAS, the Developer is a Texas limited partnership whose principal office is located in Lavon, Texas; and

WHEREAS, the Developer plans to develop in an approximately 33.177-acre tract of land more particularly described by metes and bounds in <u>Exhibit A</u> and depicted on <u>Exhibit B</u> attached hereto (the "<u>Property</u>"): and

WHEREAS, as of the Effective Date, Lavon 678 Corp. LLC owns the Property; and

WHEREAS, the Bear Creek Special Utility District ("BCSUD") holds a water certificate of convenience and necessity (a "CCN") for the Property; and

WHEREAS, the City of Lavon has sole authority for the provision of sanitary sewer services for the Property; and

WHEREAS, the development of the Property will require the following improvements to specific roads, sewer, water, drainage – attached hereto as <a href="Exhibit B">Exhibit B</a>; and

WHEREAS, the development of the property will require certain on-site public improvements including streets and roads; drainage; water; sanitary sewer and other utility systems; parks, open space, landscaping and trail systems; and land for on-site public improvements, described on <a href="Exhibit C">Exhibit C</a> (collectively, the "On-Site Public Improvements"); and

Facilities Development Agreement - Lake Breeze Phase 1

WHEREAS, certain off-site public improvements necessary to provide adequate access and bring water and sanitary sewer service to the Property, as further described on **Exhibit D** (collectively, the "Off-Site Public Improvements"); and

WHEREAS, the Off-Site Public Improvements will be constructed within existing right-of-way or will be constructed in easements; and

WHEREAS, the Parties have determined that they have the authority to enter into this Agreement; and

WHEREAS, it is the intent of this Agreement to establish certain legally binding restrictions and commitments to be imposed upon such Property; and the Parties are proceeding in reliance on the enforceability of this Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of mutual agreements, covenants and conditions contained herein, and other good and valuable consideration, the Parties hereby agree as follows:

#### I. REPRESENTATIONS

- A. <u>Recitals</u>. The recitals contained in this Agreement are true and correct as of the Effective Date and form the basis upon which the Parties negotiated and entered into this Agreement.
- B. Authority. The City represents and warrants that this Agreement has been approved and duly adopted by the City Council of the City in accordance with all applicable public meeting and public notice requirements (including, but not limited to, notices required by the Texas Open Meetings Act), and that the individual executing this Agreement on behalf of the City has been authorized to do so. The Developer represents and warrants that this Agreement has been approved by appropriate action of the Developer, and that the individual executing this Agreement on behalf of the Developer has been authorized to do so.

#### II. GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

- A. It is agreed and understood by the Parties hereto that the Developer shall employ, at its sole cost, a civil engineer licensed to practice in the State of Texas for the design and preparation of the plans and specifications for the construction of all facilities covered by this Agreement.
- B. The Developer agrees to cause to be furnished to the City maintenance bonds, letters of credit or cash escrow amounting to 100% of the cost of construction of underground utilities and 100% of the construction cost for paving. These maintenance bonds, letters of credit or cash escrow will be for a period of two (2) years and will be issued prior to the final City acceptance of the public improvements. The maintenance bonds, letters of credit or cash escrow will be supplied to the City by the contractors performing the work, and the City will be named as the beneficiary if the contractors fail to perform any required maintenance.

- C. It is further agreed and understood by the Parties hereto that upon acceptance of City public infrastructure by the City, title to all facilities and improvements mentioned hereinabove shall be vested in the City and Developer hereby relinquishes any right, title or interest in and to said facilities or any part thereof. It is further understood and agreed that until the City accepts such improvements, the City shall have no liability or responsibility in connection with any such facilities. Acceptance of the facilities shall occur at such time that the City, through its City Administrator or duly authorized representative, provides Developer with a written acknowledgement that all facilities are complete, have been inspected and approved and are being accepted by the City. The Developer agrees that the exactions on this project are roughly the same as the improvements in the subdivision.
- D. On all public facilities included in this Agreement for which Developer awards his own construction contract, Developer agrees to the following procedure:
  - Developer agrees to pay the following:
    - a. Inspection fees equal to four percent (4%) of the project cost of the street, drainage and sanitary sewer facilities, on all facilities included in this Agreement for which Developer awards his or her own construction contract, to be paid prior to construction of each phase and based on actual bid construction cost:
    - b. All Third-Party Laboratory Testing (e.g., subgrade density, concrete strength, pipeline testing, etc.);
    - c. The additional charge for inspections during Saturday, Sunday, holidays, and outside of normal working hours;
    - d. Any charges for re-testing as a result of failed tests:
    - e. All gradation tests required to insure proper cement and/or lime stabilization.
  - 2. The Developer agrees to hire a City-approved laboratory to conduct the following and Developer will be billed directly by the vendor:
    - a. All nuclear density tests on the roadway subgrade:
    - Technicians time for preparing concrete cylinders;
    - Concrete cylinder tests and concrete coring samples; and
    - d. Pipeline, manhole, related infrastructures tests, etc.

The City can delay connection of buildings to sanitary sewer service lines constructed under this Agreement until said sanitary sewer service lines have been completed to the satisfaction of and acceptance by the City. In addition, acceptance of the water mains by the BCSUD must be provided. IN THE EVENT THAT SUCH CONNECTION TO SANITARY SEWER SERVICE LINES IS DELAYED BY THE CITY, THE DEVELOPER AGREES TO RELEASE, INDEMNIFY AND HOLD THE CITY HARMLESS FROM ANY AND ALL DAMAGES, LOSS, OR INCIDENTAL OR CONSEQUENTIAL DAMAGES

### RESULTING FROM ANY DELAYS IN PROVIDING SANITARY SEWER SERVICE.

- E. The Developer and any third-party, independent entity engaged in the construction of houses, (hereinafter referred to as "Builder") will be responsible for mowing all grass and weeds and otherwise reasonably maintaining the aesthetics of all land and lots in said Addition which have not been sold to third parties. After fifteen (15) days' written notice, should the Developer or Builder fail in this responsibility, the City may contract for this service and bill the Developer or Builder for reasonable costs. Should such cost remain unpaid for 120 days after written notice, the City can file a lien on such property so maintained.
- F. Any guarantee of payment instrument (Performance Bond, Letter of Credit, etc.) submitted by the Developer or Contractor on a form other than the one which has been previously approved by the City as "acceptable" shall be submitted to the City Attorney and this Agreement shall not be considered in effect until such City Attorney has approved the instrument. Approval by the City shall not be unreasonably withheld or delayed.
- G. Any surety company through which a bond is written shall be a surety company duly authorized to do business in the State of Texas, provided that the City, through the City Administrator, shall retain the right to reject any surety company as a surety for any work under this or any other Developer's Agreement within the City regardless of such company's authorization to do business in Texas. Approval by the City shall not be unreasonably withheld or delayed.

#### III. FACILITIES

Public infrastructure facilities will be designed and constructed in accordance with the City's adopted Standard Construction Details, as may be amended from time to time by the City Council.

#### A. ON SITE WATER

The Developer hereby agrees to install water facilities to service lots as shown on the final plat of the Addition. Water facilities will be installed in accordance with plans and specifications to be prepared by the Developer's engineer and released by the City after BCSUD review and approval. Further, the Developer agrees to complete this installation in accordance with the latest requirements of BCSUD, city ordinance or regulations and shall be solely responsible for all construction costs, materials and engineering.

#### B. DRAINAGE

Developer hereby agrees to construct the necessary drainage facilities within the Addition. These facilities shall be in accordance with the plans and specifications to be prepared by Developer's engineers and approved by the City. Plans and specifications shall conform to current City Standard Construction Details in effect at the time of Final Plat submission. The Developer hereby agrees to fully comply with all EPA and TCEQ requirements relating to the planning, permitting and management of storm water which may be in force at the time that

development proposals are being presented for approval by the City. The Developer hereby agrees to comply with all provisions of the Texas Water Code. All drainage shall conform to current (at time of Final Plat submission) iSWMM standards as approved by the North Central Texas Council of Governments.

#### C. LAW COMPLIANCE

Developer hereby agrees to comply with all federal, state, and local laws that are applicable to development of this Addition.

#### D. STREETS

- The street construction in the Addition shall conform to the requirements in accordance with plans and specifications to be prepared by the Developer's engineer and approved by the City. Plans and specifications shall conform to current City Standard Construction Details in effect at the time of Final Plat submission.
- 2. The Developer will be responsible for:
  - a. Installation and one-year operation cost of streetlights, which is payable to the City prior to final acceptance of the Addition; or an agreement with utility provider stating that no charge will be made for streetlights for the one-year duration.
  - b. Installation of all street signs designating the names of the streets inside the Addition, said signs to be of a type, size, color and design standard to fully comply with City Ordinances.
  - c. Installation of all regulatory signs recommended based upon the Texas Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices (TMUTCD), latest edition, as prepared by the Developer's engineer by an engineering study or direction by the Director of Public Works. It is understood that Developer may put in signage having unique architectural features, however, should the signs be moved or destroyed by any means the City is only responsible for replacement of standard signage.
- 3. All street improvements will be subject to inspection and approval by the City. No work shall begin on any street included herein prior to complying with the requirements contained elsewhere in this Agreement. All water, sanitary sewer, and storm drainage utilities which are anticipated to be installed within the street or within the street right-of-way will be completed prior to the commencement of street construction on the specific section of street in which the utility improvements have been placed or for which they are programmed. It is understood by and between the Developer and the City that this requirement is aimed at substantial compliance with the majority of the pre-planned facilities.

It is understood that in every construction project a decision later may be made to realign a line or service which may occur after construction has commenced. The Developer hereby agrees to advise the City as quickly as possible when such a need has been identified and to work cooperatively with the City to make such utility change in a manner that will be least disruptive to street construction or stability.

#### E. SANITARY SEWER FACILITIES

The Developer hereby agrees to install on-site sanitary sewer collection facilities to service lots as shown on the final plat of the Addition. Sanitary sewer facilities will be installed in accordance with the plans and specifications to be prepared by the Developer's engineer and approved by the City. Plans and specifications shall conform to current City Standard Construction Details in effect at the time of Final Plat submission. Further, the Developer agrees to complete this installation in compliance with all applicable city ordinances, regulations and codes and shall be responsible for all construction costs, materials and engineering. In the event that certain sewer lines are to be oversized because of City requirements, the City will reimburse the Developer for the oversize cost greater than the cost of a 12" line.

#### F. EROSION CONTROL

During construction of the Addition and after the streets have been installed, the Developer agrees to keep the streets free from soil build-up. The Developer agrees to use soil control measures, such as those included in the NCTCOG STANDARD SPECIFICATIONS FOR PUBLIC WORKS CONSTRUCTION, Division 1000 EROSION AND SEDIMENT CONTROL to prevent soil erosion. It will be the Developer's responsibility to present to the City a soil control development plan that will be implemented for this Addition. When in the opinion of the Director of Public Works there is sufficient soil build-up on the streets or other drainage areas and notification has been given to the Developer, the Developer will have seventy-two (72) hours to clear the soil from the streets or affected areas. If the Developer does not remove the soil from the street within 72 hours, the City may cause the soil to be removed either by contract or City forces and place the soil within the Addition at the Developer's expense. All expenses must be paid to the City prior to acceptance of the Addition.

After construction of the Addition and prior to acceptance by the City, the Developer agrees to have a permanent erosion control plan prepared and approved by the City and have the plan installed and working, effectively, in the opinion of the Director of Public Works. This erosion control will prevent soil erosion from the newly created lots from washing into street rights of way, drainage ways or other private property.

#### G. AMENITIES

It is understood by and between the City and Developer that the Addition may incorporate a number of unique amenities and aesthetic improvements such as ponds, aesthetic lakes, unique landscaping, and walls and may incorporate specialty signage and accessory facilities. The Developer agrees to accept responsibility, at its sole cost, for the construction and maintenance of all such aesthetic or specialty item such as walls, vegetation, signage, and landscaping,

street furniture, pond and lake improvements until such responsibility is turned over to a fully functioning homeowners association.

#### H. USE OF PUBLIC RIGHT-OF-WAY

It is understood by and between the City and Developer that the Developer may provide unique amenities within public right-of-way, such as landscaping, irrigation, lighting, etc., for the enhancement of the Addition. The Developer agrees to maintain these amenities, at its sole cost, until such responsibility is turned over to a fully functioning homeowners association. THE DEVELOPER AND HIS SUCCESSORS AND ASSIGNS UNDERSTAND THAT THE CITY SHALL NOT BE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE REPLACEMENT OF THESE AMENITIES UNDER ANY CIRCUMSTANCES AND FURTHER AGREES TO RELEASE, INDEMNIFY AND HOLD HARMLESS THE CITY FROM ANY AND ALL DAMAGES, LOSS OR LIABILITY OF ANY KIND WHATSOEVER BY REASON OF INJURY TO PROPERTY OR THIRD PERSON OCCASIONED BY ITS USE OF THE PUBLIC RIGHT-OF-WAY WITH REGARD TO THESE IMPROVEMENTS AND THE DEVELOPER SHALL, AT ITS SOLE COST AND EXPENSE, DEFEND AND PROTECT THE CITY AGAINST ALL SUCH CLAIMS AND DEMANDS.

#### START OF CONSTRUCTION

Before the construction of the streets, sanitary sewer, or drainage facilities can begin, the following shall take place:

- 1. At least one (1) large sheet set and three 11x17 sets of construction plans to be stamped "Released for Construction" by the City.
- 2. All fees required to be paid to the City.
- 3. Facilities Development Agreement must be executed.
- 4. The Developer, or contractor, shall furnish to the City a policy of general liability insurance, naming the City as co-insured, prior to commencement of any work. All insurance must meet the Requirements of Contractor's Insurance attached hereto as <a href="Exhibit E">Exhibit E</a> and incorporated herein for all purposes.
- 5. A pre-construction meeting between Developer and City is required. Developer or contractor shall furnish to the City a list of all subcontractors and suppliers that will be providing greater than a \$1,000 value to the Addition.

#### IV. GENERAL PROVISIONS

#### A. INDEMNIFICATION

DEVELOPER COVENANTS AND AGREES TO INDEMNIFY AND DOES HEREBY INDEMNIFY, HOLD HARMLESS AND DEFEND CITY, ITS OFFICERS, AGENTS, SERVANTS AND EMPLOYEES, FROM AND AGAINST ANY AND ALL CLAIMS OR SUITS FOR PROPERTY DAMAGE OR LOSS AND/OR PERSONAL INJURY, INCLUDING DEATH, TO ANY AND ALL

PERSONS OF WHATSOEVER KIND OR CHARACTER, WHETHER REAL OR ASSERTED, (INCLUDING, WITHOUT LIMITATION, REASONABLE FEES AND EXPENSES OF ATTORNEYS, EXPERT WITNESSES AND OTHER CONSULTANTS), ARISING OUT OF OR IN CONNECTION WITH, DIRECTLY OR INDIRECTLY, THE CONSTRUCTION, MAINTENANCE, OCCUPANCY, USE, EXISTENCE OR LOCATION OF SAID IMPROVEMENT OR IMPROVEMENTS, AND SHALL FURTHER BE LIABLE FOR INJURY OR DAMAGE TO CITY PROPERTY, ARISING OUT OF OR IN CONNECTION WITH ANY AND ALL ACTS OR OMISSIONS OF DEVELOPER, ITS OFFICERS, AGENTS, SERVANTS, EMPLOYEES, CONTRACTORS, SUBCONTRACTORS, LICENSEES, OR INVITEES, SAID INDEMNIFICATION TO REMAIN IN EFFECT UNTIL THE CITY ACCEPTS THE ADDITION.

- B. DEVELOPER'S ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF THE CITY'S COMPLIANCE WITH FEDERAL AND STATE CONSTITUTIONS, STATUTES AND CASE LAW AND FEDERAL, STATE AND LOCAL ORDINANCES, RULES AND REGULATIONS/DEVELOPERS' WAIVER AND RELEASE OF CLAIMS FOR OBLIGATIONS IMPOSED BY THIS AGREEMENT.
  - (a) THE DEVELOPER ACKNOWLEDGES AND AGREES THAT:
  - (I) THE PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS TO BE CONSTRUCTED UNDER THIS AGREEMENT, AND THE FEES TO BE IMPOSED BY THE CITY PURSUANT TO THIS AGREEMENT, REGARDING THE PROPERTY, IN WHOLE OR IN PART, DO NOT CONSTITUTE A:
    - (A) TAKING UNDER THE TEXAS OR UNITED STATES CONSTITUTION;
    - (B) VIOLATION OF THE TEXAS LOCAL GOVERNMENT CODE, AS IT EXISTS OR MAY BE AMENDED; AND/OR
    - (C) NUISANCE.
  - (II) ASSUMING NO DEFAULTS UNDER THIS AGREEMENT, THE AMOUNT OF THE DEVELOPER'S FINANCIAL AND INFRASTRUCTURE CONTRIBUTION FOR THE PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS IS ROUGHLY PROPORTIONAL TO THE DEMAND THAT THE DEVELOPER'S ANTICIPATED IMPROVEMENTS AND DEVELOPER'S DEVELOPMENT OF THE PROPERTY PLACES ON THE CITY'S INFRASTRUCTURE.
  - (III) ASSUMING NO DEFAULTS UNDER THIS AGREEMENT, THE DEVELOPER HEREBY AGREES AND ACKNOWLEDGES, WITHOUT WAIVING CLAIMS RELATED SOLELY TO EXACTIONS NOT CONTEMPLATED BY THIS AGREEMENT, THAT: (A) ANY PROPERTY WHICH IT CONVEYS TO THE CITY OR ACQUIRES FOR THE CITY PURSUANT TO THIS AGREEMENT IS ROUGHLY PROPORTIONAL TO THE

BENEFIT RECEIVED BY THE DEVELOPER FOR SUCH LAND, AND THE DEVELOPER HEREBY WAIVES ANY CLAIM THEREFOR THAT IT MAY HAVE; AND (B) ALL PREREQUISITES TO SUCH DETERMINATION OF ROUGH PROPORTIONALITY HAVE BEEN MET, AND ANY VALUE RECEIVED BY THE CITY RELATIVE TO SAID CONVEYANCE IS RELATED BOTH IN NATURE AND EXTENT TO THE IMPACT OF THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE PROPERTY ON THE CITY'S INFRASTRUCTURE. ASSUMING NO DEFAULTS UNDER THIS AGREEMENT, THE DEVELOPER FURTHER AGREES TO WAIVE AND RELEASE ALL CLAIMS IT MAY HAVE AGAINST THE CITY UNDER THIS AGREEMENT RELATED TO ANY AND ALL: (A) CLAIMS OR CAUSES OF ACTION BASED ON ILLEGAL OR EXCESSIVE EXACTIONS; AND (B) ROUGH PROPORTIONALITY AND INDIVIDUAL DETERMINATION REQUIREMENTS MANDATED BY THE UNITED STATES SUPREME COURT IN DOLAN V. CITY OF TIGARD, 512 U.S. 374 (1994), AND ITS PROGENY, AS WELL AS ANY OTHER REQUIREMENTS OF A NEXUS BETWEEN DEVELOPMENT CONDITIONS AND THE PROJECTED IMPACT OF THE PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS.

(IV) THIS AGREEMENT SHALL CONFER NO VESTED RIGHTS ON THE PROPERTY, OR ANY PORTION THEREOF, UNLESS SPECIFICALLY ENUMERATED HEREIN. IN ADDITION, NOTHING CONTAINED IN THIS AGREEMENT SHALL CONSTITUTE A "PERMIT" AS DEFINED IN CHAPTER 245, TEXAS LOCAL GOVERNMENT CODE, DEVELOPER ACKNOWLEDGES AND AGREES ON ITS OWN BEHALF THAT THIS AGREEMENT IS NOT REQUIRED BY CITY FOR DEVELOPER TO DEVELOP ITS PROPERTY. DEVELOPER WAIVES ANY STATUTORY CLAIM UNDER CHAPTER 245 OF THE TEXAS LOCAL GOVERNMENT CODE UNDER THIS AGREEMENT.

### (b) THIS SECTION IV(B) SHALL SURVIVE THE TERMINATION OF THIS AGREEMENT.

- C. Developer acknowledges that an element of consideration for City to enter in to this Agreement is Developer's indemnification, release and assignment of claims contained in this Section IV.
- D. Venue of any action brought hereunder shall be in Lavon, Collin County, Texas.
- E. Approval by the Director of Public Works or other City employee of any plans, designs or specifications submitted by the Developer pursuant to this Agreement shall not constitute or be deemed to be a release of the responsibility and liability of the Developer, his engineer, employees, officers or agents for the accuracy and competency of their design and specifications. Such approval shall not be deemed to be an assumption of such responsibility and liability by the City for any defect in the design and specifications prepared by the consulting engineer, his officers, agents, servants or employees, it being the intent of the parties that

- approval by the Director of Public Works signifies the City's approval on only the general design concept of the improvements to be constructed.
- F. This Agreement or any part herein, or any interest herein, shall not be assigned by the Developer without the express written consent of the City Administrator, which shall not be unreasonably withheld or delayed.
- G. On all facilities included in this Agreement for which the Developer awards its own construction contract, the Developer agrees to employ a construction contractor who is approved by the City, and whose approval shall not be unreasonably withheld or delayed, said contractor to meet City and statutory requirements for being insured, licensed and bonded to do work in public streets and to be qualified in all respects to bid on public streets and to be qualified in all respects to bid on public projects of a similar nature. A policy of general liability insurance is also required of the Contractor.
- H. The City is an exempt organization under Section 151.309, Tax Code, and the facilities constructed under this Agreement will be dedicated to public use and accepted by the City upon acknowledgement by the City of completion under Paragraph 1.F.
  - 1. The purchase of tangible personal property, other than machinery or equipment and its accessories, repair, and replacement parts, for use in the performance of this Agreement is, therefore, exempt from taxation under Chapter 151, Tax Code, if the tangible property is:
    - a. necessary and essential for the performance of the Agreement; and
    - b. completely consumed at the job site.
  - 2. The purchase of a taxable service for use in the performance of this Agreement is exempt if the service is performed at the job site and if:
    - a. this Agreement expressly requires the specific service to be provided or purchased by the person performing the Agreement; or
    - b. the service is integral to the performance of the Agreement.
- I. Prior to final acceptance of the Addition, the Developer shall provide to the City one (1) hard copy and one (1) DVD or flash-drive type media of electronic (.pdf) of Record Drawings of the Addition, showing the facilities as actually constructed.
- J. Such drawings will be stamped and signed by a Texas registered professional civil engineer. In addition, the Developer shall provide CAD base map files showing all lot lines, easements, streets and utilities and tie into the State Plane Coordinate System.
- K. All notices required or contemplated by this Agreement (or otherwise given in connection with this Agreement) shall be in writing, shall be signed by or on behalf of the Party giving the notice, and shall be effective as follows: (a) on or after the 10<sup>th</sup> business day after being deposited with the United States mail service, Certified Mail, Return Receipt Requested; (b) on the day delivered by a private delivery or private messenger service (such as FedEx or UPS) as

evidenced by a receipt signed by any person at the delivery address (whether or not such person is the person to whom the notice is addressed); or (c) otherwise on the day actually received by the person to whom the notice is addressed, including, but not limited to, delivery in person and delivery by regular mail or by E-mail. Notices given pursuant to this section shall be addressed as follows:

- L. The Parties acknowledge that each of them has been actively involved in negotiating this Agreement. Accordingly, the rule of construction that any ambiguities are to be resolved against the drafting Party will not apply to interpreting this Agreement. In the event of any dispute over the meaning or application of any provision of this Agreement, the provision will be interpreted fairly and reasonably and neither more strongly for nor against any Party, regardless of which Party originally drafted the provision.
- M. Each Party acknowledges and agrees that this Agreement is binding upon such Party and enforceable against such Party in accordance with its terms and conditions.
- N. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the Parties and supersedes all prior agreements, whether oral or written, covering the subject matter of this Agreement. This Agreement shall not be modified or amended except in writing signed by the Parties. If any provision of this Agreement is determined by a court of competent jurisdiction to be unenforceable for any

reason, such unenforceable provision shall be deleted from this Agreement, and the remainder of this Agreement shall remain in full force and effect and shall be interpreted to give effect to the intent of the Parties.

- O. Any failure by a Party to insist upon strict performance by another Party of any material provision of this Agreement shall not be deemed a waiver thereof, and the Party shall have the right at any time thereafter to insist upon strict performance of any and all provisions of this Agreement. No provision of this Agreement may be waived except by writing signed by the Party waiving such provision. Any waiver shall be limited to the specific purposes for which it is given. No waiver by any Party of any term or condition of this Agreement shall be deemed or construed to be a waiver of any other term or condition or subsequent waiver of the same term or condition.
- P. This Agreement only inures to the benefit of, and may only be enforced by, the Parties. No other person or entity shall have any right, title, or interest under this Agreement or otherwise be deemed to be a third-party beneficiary of this Agreement.
- Q. Each Party shall use good faith, due diligence and reasonable care in the performance of its respective obligations under this Agreement, and time shall be of the essence in such performance; however, in the event a Party is unable, due to force majeure, to perform its obligations under this Agreement, then the obligations affected by the force majeure shall be temporarily suspended. Within three business days after the occurrence of a force majeure, the Party claiming the right to temporarily suspend its performance, shall give notice to all the Parties, including a detailed explanation of the force majeure and a description of the action that will be taken to remedy the force majeure and resume full performance at the earliest possible time. The term "force majeure" shall include events or circumstances that are not within the reasonable control of the Party whose performance is suspended and that could not have been avoided by such Party with the exercise of good faith, due diligence and reasonable care.
- R. This Agreement may be executed in any number of counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original and constitute one and the same instrument.

### V. OTHER ISSUES

### A. OFF-SITE DRAINAGE

Improvements will be provided in accordance with the flood study as approved by the City Engineer.

### B. OFF-SITE SANITARY SEWER

- 1) The Addition is to be developed in phases, as shown on <u>Exhibit B</u> hereto and is anticipated to have approximately 194 equivalent single-family wastewater connections ("<u>ESFCs</u>"), (109 residential lots and 27.371 commercial acres).
- 2) In order to connect the Addition to the wastewater facilities of the City, the Developer will tie into the existing 24"/21"/15" wastewater pipeline, which extends from the Bear Creek WWTP northeasterly to a point approximately 1,500 linear feet north of FM 2755 (the "Bear Creek Trunk Sewer"), and LakePointe Phase 1 onsite ("S-3" and portion of "S-1" per Development Plans for LakePointe Phase 1 dated July 14, 2020) and 10"/15" offsite wastewater pipeline (collectively, the "LakePointe Sewer").
- 3) The Bear Creek Trunk Sewer and LakePointe Sewer wastewater pipelines have been sized to serve the Addition and certain other properties located near the Addition.

### 4) Capacity and Share of Bear Creek Trunk Line and LakePointe Sewer

- a) <u>Capacity</u>. The City shall set aside and continuously maintain sufficient capacity within the City System, including the Bear Creek Trunk Sewer and LakePointe Sewer, to provide wastewater service adequate to serve the Addition at full build-out.
- b) <u>Timing</u>. The Parties agree and acknowledge that the Developer shall proceed at its own pace to develop the Addition. Upon completion of all or a phase of the Internal Facilities necessary to serve all or a portion of the Property, and connection of those Internal Facilities to the LakePointe Sewer, the City shall commence providing retail wastewater service to that portion of the Property ready to be served.
- c) Bear Creek Trunk Sewer and LakePointe Sewer Capacity Fee and Reservation. The Parties agree and acknowledge that the Bear Creek Trunk Sewer and LakePointe Sewer is necessary to provide wastewater services to the Addition. Construction of the Bear Creek Trunk Sewer and LakePointe Sewer have been completed by third-party developers with a total cost of \$1,836,600.48. For the purpose of this pro-rata share calculation, commercial district land

use shall have an equivalency of 3.1 equivalent residential units per acre. The City and the Developer agree that Developer's pro-rata share of the costs of the design, engineering, and construction of the Sewer Connection, based upon 194 ESFCs (109 residential lots and 27.371 commercial acres), is \$151,446.81 ("Developer's Pro-rata"). or \$780.65 per equivalent single-family wastewater connection (ESFC). Upon payment of Developer's Pro-rata as set forth in Exhibit D of this Agreement, the City shall reserve and guarantee wastewater capacity in the City System for every equivalent single-family wastewater connection on the final plat for which the Developer's Pro-rata was paid. The Parties agree and acknowledge that should additional ESFCs be required to provide service to amenity centers or recreational facilities on platted lot(s), the City shall provide such capacity.

d) Payments for the Bear Creek Trunk Sewer and LakePointe Sewer. The Developer shall pay Developer's Pro-rata for wastewater capacity on a ESFC per phase basis paid when the Final Plat and construction plans are approved for such lots as set forth in Exhibit D. The final plat shall not be filed with the county and the construction plans shall not be released by the City until Developer's Pro-rata for every ESFC on such final plat has been paid to the City. The Developer shall not be responsible for the payment of any portion of the Bear Creek Trunk Sewer or LakePointe Sewer other than Developer's Pro-rata.

### C. PARK LAND

The Developer shall construct, own and maintain, at its sole cost, eight foot (8') concrete walks as referenced in <u>Exhibit F</u>. The walk design shall be approved by the City Engineer. The walks shall be owned and maintained by the Homeowners Association and shall be open to the public's use.

The Homeowners Association shall own and maintain the common areas, any medians, the landscape buffers abutting public roadways and the open space dedicated along the southern boundary of the development.

### D. FENCES AND WALLS

All retaining walls greater than 48" in height are to be designed by a professional engineer licensed in the State of Texas. Certification that the walls have been constructed in accordance with the design shall be provided to the City prior to final acceptance of the Addition.

All retaining walls and common area fencing shall be constructed within a wall/fence maintenance easement and/or HOA maintained common area/tract. The Developer agrees to maintain these walls and fences, at its sole cost, until such responsibility is turned over to a fully functioning homeowners association.

### E. DESIGN GUIDELINES

### 1) RETAIL DISTRICT STANDARDS

- a) No service canopies, drive-thru lanes, service doors for auto or similar service shall face the public street nor a residential lot or residential zoning district unless a conditional use permit is granted. (E.1.)
- b) Architectural and/or landscape elements shall be designed to provide shade on the south and west exposures to protect patrons in plazas, patios and other public spaces. (E.5.)
- c) Accessory structures such as trash enclosures, utility services, telecommunication equipment and heating/cooling systems shall be screened from view of neighboring buildings, sites and roadways. Materials to screen around these systems shall match or compliment adjacent building materials. Gates shall not allow for view of the contents of the enclosure. (E.8.)
- d) All sides of a building shall be designed with consistent architectural and façade elements. Roofline silhouettes shall be broken up through the use of large cornices, changes in parapet heights, or other techniques such as awnings, bulb-outs, and reliefs. At least fifty percent (50%) of the total façade shall use features such as windows, awnings, entryways, columns, architectural relief to discourage long expanses of bare wall. All exterior metals and plastics (vents, flashings, and gutters) shall be screened from view, painted or treated to blend in with the adjacent surrounding materials. (E.10.)
- e) All glass, plastic or other transparent materials shall be treated to eliminate reflective glare. (E.11.)

### 2) RESIDENTIAL DISTRICT STANDARDS

- a) There shall be no duplication of the same house elevation or exterior color palette within three adjacent lots on either side of the lot or on the lot directly across the street.
- b) All elevations of residential structures (excluding doors and windows) shall be 80% masonry or stone construction as the primary building material; except the rear elevation may be a minimum of 50% masonry or stone if the remainder of the rear elevation is constructed of cementitious fiberboard.
- c) Cementitious fiberboard shall be used as a secondary façade material in locations where wood material would be utilized; when

- installed as overlapping boards, cementitious fiberboard shall be installed horizontally.
- d) Vinyl siding or similar façade materials shall be prohibited.
- e) All roofs will have a minimum roof pitch of 8:12 within 80% of the roof area.
- f) Roof shingles throughout the development shall have the same color tones and be a minimum 30-year asphalt composition.
- g) Heating and air conditioning equipment shall be located in rear yards unless inside main fenced yard area.



### REQUIREMENTS FOR CONTRACTOR'S INSURANCE

### Contractor's Insurance

- 1. Without limiting any of the other obligations or liabilities of the CONTRACTOR, during the term of the Contract, the CONTRACTOR shall purchase and maintain the following minimum insurance coverages with companies duly approved to do business in the State of Texas and satisfactory to the CITY. In this section "Project" shall mean the public facilities to be constructed by Developer or under Developer's contract with a CONTRACTOR. Coverages shall be of the following types and not less than the specified amounts:
  - a. Workers' compensation as required by Texas law, with the policy endorsed to provide a waiver of subrogation as to the CITY; employer's liability insurance of not less than the minimum statutory amounts.
  - b. Commercial general liability insurance, including premises- operations; independent CONTRACTOR's liability, completed operations and contractual liability covering, but not limited to, the liability assumed under the indemnification provisions of this Contract, fully insuring CONTRACTOR's (or Subcontractor's) liability for injury to or death of CITY's employees and third parties, extended to include personal injury liability coverage with damage to property of third parties, broad form property damage, with minimum limits as set forth below:

Bodily Injury \$1,000,000 Each Occurrence Property Damage \$1,000,000 Each Occurrence

Products-Components/Operations Aggregate...\$ 1,000,000

Personal and Advertising Injury . . . . . . . . . \$ 1,000,000

(With Employment Exclusion deleted)

Contractual Liability:

Bodily Injury \$1,000,000 Each occurrence

Property Damage \$1,000,000 Each occurrence

The policy shall include coverage extended to apply to completed operations, asbestos hazards (if this project involves work with asbestos) and ECU (explosion, collapse and underground) hazards. The completed operations coverage must be maintained for a minimum of one year after final completion and acceptance of the work, with evidence of same filed with CITY.

c. Comprehensive automobile and truck liability insurance, covering owned, hired and nonowned vehicles, with a combined bodily injury and property damage minimum limit of \$1,000,000 per occurrence; or separate limits of \$500,000 for bodily injury (per person), and \$500,000 for property damage. Such insurance shall include coverage for loading and unloading hazards.

### d. Property Insurance (Builder's All Risk)

- (i) CONTRACTOR shall purchase and maintain, at all times during the term of its Contract with the Developer property insurance written on a builder's risk "all-risk" or equivalent policy form in the amount of the initial contract price, plus value of subsequent contract modifications and cost of materials supplied or installed by others, comprising total value for the entire Project at the site on a replacement cost basis without optional deductibles. Such property insurance shall be maintained, unless otherwise in writing by all persons and entities who are beneficiaries of such insurance, until final payment has been made, or until no person or entity other than the CITY has an insurable interest in the property required by this paragraph to be covered, whichever is later. This insurance shall include interests of the CITY, the CONTRACTOR, Subcontractors and Sub-Subcontractors in the Project.
- (ii) Property insurance shall be on an "all-risk" or equivalent policy form and shall include, without limitation, insurance against the perils of fire (with extended coverage) and physical loss or damage including, without duplication of coverage, theft, vandalism, malicious mischief, collapse, earthquake, flood, windstorm, falsework, testing and startup, temporary buildings and debris removal including demolition occasioned by enforcement of any applicable legal requirements, and shall cover reasonable compensation for CONTRACTOR's services and expenses required as a result of such insured loss.
- (iii) If the insurance required by this paragraph requires deductibles, the CONTRACTOR shall pay costs not covered because of such deductibles.
- (iv) This property insurance shall cover portions of the Work stored off the site, and also portions of the Work in transit.

### e. OWNER's Protective Liability Insurance:

- (i) CONTRACTOR shall obtain, pay for and maintain at all times during the prosecution of the work under the contract between the CONTRACTOR and the Developer, a CITY's protective liability insurance policy naming the CITY as insured for property damage and bodily injury, which may arise in the prosecution of the work or CONTRACTOR's operations under the contract.
- (ii) Coverage shall be on an "occurrence" basis, and the policy shall be issued by the same insurance company that carries the CONTRACTOR's liability insurance with a combined bodily injury and property damage minimum limit of \$1,000,000 per occurrence.

f. "Umbrella" Liability Insurance:

The CONTRACTOR shall obtain, pay for and maintain umbrella liability insurance during the term of the Contract between the CONTRACTOR and the Developer, insuring CONTRACTOR for an amount of not less than \$5,000,000 per occurrence combined limit for bodily injury and property damage that follows form and applies in excess of the primary liability coverages required herein above. The policy shall provide "drop down" coverage where underlying primary insurance coverage limits are insufficient or exhausted.

### Policy Endorsements


- 1. Each insurance policy to be furnished by CONTRACTOR shall include the following conditions by endorsement to the policy:
  - a. names the CITY as an additional insured as to all applicable policies;
  - each policy shall require that 30 days prior to cancellation, non-renewal or any material change in coverage, a notice thereof shall be given to CITY by certified mail. If the policy is canceled for nonpayment of premium, only 10 days written notice to CITY is required;
  - c. the term "CITY" shall include all authorities, boards, bureaus, commissions, divisions, departments and offices of the CITY and individual members, employees and agents thereof in their official capacities, and/or while acting on behalf of the CITY:
  - d. the policy phrase "other insurance" shall not apply to the CITY where the CITY is an additional insured on the policy.

### 2. Special Conditions


- a. Insurance furnished by the CONTRACTOR shall be in accordance with the following requirements:
  - i. any policy submitted shall not be subject to limitations, conditions or restrictions deemed inconsistent with the intent of the insurance requirements to be fulfilled by CONTRACTOR. The CITY's decision thereon shall be final;
  - ii. all policies are to be written through companies duly licensed to transact that class of insurance in the State of Texas; and
  - all liability policies required herein shall be written with an "occurrence" basis coverage trigger.
- b. CONTRACTOR agrees to the following:

- CONTRACTOR hereby waives subrogation rights for loss or damage to the extent same are covered by insurance. Insurers shall have no right of recovery or subrogation against the CITY, it being the intention that the insurance policies shall protect all parties to the contract and be primary coverage for all losses covered by the policies;
- ii. companies issuing the insurance polices and CONTRACTOR shall have no recourse against the CITY for payment of any premiums or assessments for any deductibles, as all such premiums and deductibles are the sole responsibility and risk of the CONTRACTOR:
- iii. approval, disapproval or failure to act by the CITY regarding any insurance supplied by the CONTRACTOR (or any Subcontractors) shall not relieve the CONTRACTOR of full responsibility or liability for damages and accidents as set forth in the Contract Documents or this Agreement. Neither shall be bankruptcy, insolvency or denial of liability by the insurance company exonerate the CONTRACTOR from liability;
- v. deductible limits on insurance policies exceeding \$10,000 require approval of the CITY:
- vi. any of such insurance policies required under this paragraph may be written in combination with any of the others, where legally permitted, but none of the specified limits may be lowered thereby:
- vii. prior to commencement of operations pursuant to this Contract, the Developer or the Developer's CONTRACTOR shall furnish the CITY with satisfactory proof that he has provided adequate insurance coverage in amounts and by approved carriers as required by this Agreement;
- viii. CONTRACTOR shall provide notice of any actual or potential claim or litigation that would affect required insurance coverages to the CITY in a timely manner;
- ix. CONTRACTOR agrees to either require its Subcontractors to maintain the same insurance coverage and limits as specified for the CONTRACTOR or coverage of Subcontractors shall be provided by the Contract; and
- x. Prior to the effective date of cancellation, CONTRACTOR shall deliver to the CITY a replacement certificate of insurance or proof of reinstatement.











Discussion and action regarding approval of a Letter of Intent to purchase a first-response brush truck for \$191,849.00 from Metro Fire Apparatus Specialists Inc.

### Background:

In the process of purchasing the 2019 Spartan Quint fire engine, the staff learned that the current lead time to purchase a first-response brush truck is approximately two years.

Considerations for the replacement of apparatus include several factors such as the wear and tear on the vehicle; age of the vehicle; mileage or service hours; call volume and response area; safety considerations of current apparatus; and current safety enhancements available. Generally recognized standards for the replacement for apparatus and equipment:

- Engines 20-year replacement. (New engine every 10 years)
- Brush Trucks 10-year replacement
- Specialty Vehicles 10-year replacement
- Staff/Command 10-year replacement.

A Letter of Intent will place the city in line to purchase an apparatus to replace the city's 2009 first-response brush truck, which will remain in service. Metro Fire Apparatus Specialists, Inc. has provided a quote for a fully equipped truck for the fixed price of \$191,849.00.

# Financial Implication:

The expenditure would be allocated in the FY 2022-23 budget. Funding is available from the Series 2020 Certificates of Obligation. The apparatus will have the full factory warranty and an additional warranty from Metro Fire Apparatus Specialists, Inc. for the additions they install.

#### Item:

Discussion and action regarding Resolution No. <u>2021-04-04</u> approving the Collin County Emergency Operations Plan and appointing the Emergency Management Coordinator for the City of Lavon.

#### Background:

The updated Collin County Emergency Operations Plan (Plan) was approved by the Collin County Commissioners Court on April 5, 2021. The Plan provides for disaster mitigation, preparedness, response, and recovery. Pursuant to the Texas Administrative Code and the Texas Government Code, each incorporated city in Texas shall participate in a local emergency management agency and shall prepare and maintain an emergency operations management plan.

## Code Excerpt:

Texas Administrative Code Title 37, Part 1, Chapter 7, Subchapter B, Rule § 7.12

Each local and interjurisdictional emergency management agency shall prepare, keep current, and distribute to appropriate officials a local or interjurisdictional emergency management plan that includes the minimum content specified by the Texas Division of Emergency Management in its local emergency planning standards and has been signed by the presiding officer(s) of the jurisdiction(s) for which it was prepared. Local and interjurisdictional plans shall be reviewed annually and must have been prepared or updated during the last five (5) years to be considered current. A copy of each plan and any changes to it will be provided to the division.

Texas Government Code Chapter 418, Subchapter E, Section 418.106 (a) LOCAL AND INTERJURISDICTIONAL EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT PLANS.

(a) Each local and interjurisdictional agency shall prepare and keep current an emergency management plan for its area providing for disaster mitigation, preparedness, response, and recovery.

The Table of Contents and an excerpt from the Collin County Emergency Management Plan is attached. A copy of the full 580-page Plan may be obtained by contacting the city staff. In the City of Lavon, the Fire Chief is the designated Emergency Management Coordinator.

## Financial Implications:

To avoid penalties and to access emergency disaster resources and assistance, the interjurisdictional Plan must be approved.

#### II. PURPOSE

This Basic Plan outlines our approach to emergency operations, and is applicable to Collin County and other cities that have signed onto the Plan. It provides general guidance for emergency management activities and an overview of methods of mitigation, preparedness, response, and recovery. The plan describes Collin County's and other jurisdiction's emergency response organization and assigns responsibilities for various emergency tasks. This plan is intended to provide a framework for more specific functional annexes that describe in more detail who does what, when, and how. This plan applies to all

Collin County officials, departments, agencies, and any local jurisdictions as a signatory on the plan. The primary audience for the Collin County Emergency Operations Plan includes Collin County and jurisdictions of the cities signed onto the plan, and includes the following:

- Collin County's chief elected official (County Judge)
- Chief elected official of signatory cities
- Other elected officials, both county and city
- · Emergency management staff
- Department, agency heads, and their staff members of the county and cities
- Leaders of local volunteer organizations that support emergency operations, and
- Others who may participate in mitigation, preparedness, response, and recovery efforts.

Jurisdictions that are covered by this plan have the primary responsibility for their respective jurisdiction, including that of mitigation, protection, prevention, response, and recovery. They can make requests for assistance to the county if their resources are not adequate to manage the incident. If the county assists a local jurisdiction, the local jurisdiction is still in charge of their event. As per current laws, the chief elected official of each jurisdiction is their respective Emergency Management Director. The mayor, of any jurisdiction under this plan, may request assistance from other levels of government if they are unable to fulfill the needs of the community during an emergency or disaster. Unless officially delegated, each city remains legally responsible for its specific jurisdiction.

#### d. Recovery

If a disaster occurs, Collin County and impacted jurisdictions will carry out a recovery program that involves both short-term and long-term efforts. Short-term operations seek to restore vital services to the community and provide for the basic needs of the public. Long-term recovery focuses on restoring the community to its normal state or an improved state. The federal government, pursuant to the Stafford Act, provides the vast majority of disaster recovery assistance, if federally declared. The recovery process includes assistance to individuals, businesses, and to government and other public institutions. Examples of recovery programs include temporary housing, restoration of government services, debris removal, restoration of utilities, disaster mental health services, and reconstruction of damaged roads and bridges. The Collin County recovery program is outlined in Annex J. Recovery

#### VI. ORGANIZATION AND ASSIGNMENT OF RESPONSIBILITIES

#### A. Organization

#### 1. General

Most departments and jurisdictions have emergency functions in addition to their normal day-to-day duties. During emergency situations, normal organizational arrangements are modified to facilitate emergency operations. The Collin County governmental organization for emergencies includes an executive group, emergency services, and support services. Attachment 3, Organization for Emergency Management depicts Collin County emergency organization.

#### 2. Executive Group (EOC Management/EOC Command)

The Executive Group provides guidance and direction for emergency management programs and for emergency response and recovery operations. The Executive Group includes the County Judge, Mayor(s), City Manager(s), and Emergency Management Coordinator(s).

#### 3. Emergency Services (Operations Section – Field and EOC)

Emergency Services include the Incident Commander and those departments, jurisdictions, and groups with primary emergency response actions. The incident commander is the person in charge at an incident site.

#### 4. Emergency Support Services (Finance/Logistics/Planning – EOC)

This group includes departments and agencies that support and sustain emergency responders and also coordinate emergency assistance provided by organized volunteer organizations, business and industry, and other sources.

#### 5. Volunteer and Other Services

This group includes organized volunteer groups and businesses that have agreed to provide certain support for emergency operations.

### B. Assignment of Responsibilities

#### 1. General

For most emergency functions, successful operations require a coordinated effort from a number of departments, jurisdictions, and groups. To facilitate a coordinated effort, elected and appointed officials, department heads, and other personnel are assigned primary responsibility for planning and coordinating specific emergency functions. Generally, primary responsibility for an emergency function will be assigned to an individual from the department or jurisdiction that has legal responsibility for that function or possesses the most appropriate knowledge and skills. Other officials, departments, and jurisdictions may be assigned support responsibilities for specific emergency functions. Attachment 4, Emergency Management Functional Responsibilities, summarizes the general emergency responsibilities of local officials, departments, and other personnel.

2. The individual having primary responsibility for an emergency function is normally responsible for coordinating preparation of and maintaining that portion of the emergency plan that addresses that function. Plan and annex assignments are outlined in Attachment 5, Annex Assignments. Listed below are general responsibilities assigned to the Executive Group, Emergency Services, Support Services, and other Support Agencies. Additional specific responsibilities can be found in the functional annexes to this plan.

#### 3. Executive Group Responsibilities

- c. The County Judge or mayor, for their respective jurisdiction, will:
  - 1) Establish objectives and priorities for the emergency management program and provide general policy guidance on the conduct of that program.
  - 2) Monitor the emergency response during disaster situations and provide direction where appropriate.
  - 3) With the assistance of the Public Information Officer and other local jurisdictions, keep the public informed during emergency situations.
  - 4) With the assistance of the legal staff, declare a local state of disaster, request the Governor declare a state of emergency, or invoke the emergency powers of government when necessary.
  - 5) Request assistance from other local governments or the State when necessary.
  - 6) Direct activation of the EOC.
  - 7) Support local jurisdictions who request support from Collin County and/or declare a disaster or emergency.
- d. The Emergency Management Coordinator, for their respective jurisdiction, will:
  - 1) Implement the policies and decisions of the governing body relating to emergency management.
  - 2) Organize the emergency management program and identify personnel, equipment, and facility needs.
  - 3) Assign emergency management program tasks to departments and agencies.
  - 4) Ensure that departments and agencies participate in emergency planning, training, and exercise activities.
  - 5) Coordinate the operational response of local emergency services.
  - 6) Coordinate activation of the EOC and supervise its operation.

- 7) Serve as the staff advisor to the County Judge on emergency management matters.
- 8) Keep the County Judge, Commissioners Court, mayor, and council apprised of our preparedness status and emergency management needs. This will be specific to which level of government the EMC serves.
- 9) Coordinate local planning and preparedness activities and the maintenance of this plan.
- 10) Ensure resource inventories are being prepared and maintained by appropriate departments and/or agencies.
- 11) Arrange appropriate training for local emergency management personnel and emergency responders.
- 12) Coordinate periodic emergency exercises or drills to evaluate Collin County's plan and training.
- 13) Manage the EOC, develop procedures for its operation, and conduct training for those who staff it.
- 14) Perform day-to-day liaison duties with the state emergency management staff and other local emergency management personnel.
- 15) Coordinate with organized volunteer groups and businesses regarding emergency operations.
- 4. Common Responsibilities/All emergency services and support services will:
  - a. Provide personnel, equipment, and supplies to support emergency operations upon request.
  - b. Develop and maintain SOPs for emergency tasks.
  - c. Provide trained personnel to staff the ICP and EOC and conduct emergency operations, as requested.
  - d. Provide current information on emergency resources for inclusion in the Resource List in Appendix 1 to Annex M, Resource Management.
  - e. Report information regarding emergency situations and damage to facilities and equipment to the Incident Commander or the EOC.
  - f. Establish and maintain a manpower reserve and coordinate assignment of reserve personnel to departments and agencies that require augmentation, as able.
  - g. Maintain records of emergency-related expenditures for all purchases and personnel expenses.
- 5. Emergency Services Responsibilities
  - a. The Incident Commander will:
    - 1) Manage emergency response resources and operations at the ICP or on-scene to resolve the emergency situation.
    - Determine and implement required protective actions for response personnel and the public at the incident site. See Attachment 7. Incident Command System and Unified Command Summary.
    - 3) See Attachment 4. Emergency Management Functional Responsibilities.

#### b. Warning

- 1) Primary responsibility for this function is delegated by the County Judge to the Collin County Sheriff's Office, who will prepare and maintain Annex A (Warning) to this plan and supporting SOPs.
- 2) Emergency tasks to be performed include:
  - a) Receive information on emergency situations.
  - b) Alert key local officials of emergency situations.
  - c) Disseminate warning information and instructions to the public through available warning systems.
  - d) Disseminate warning and instructions to special facilities such as schools and hospitals.

#### c. Communications

- 1) Primary responsibility for this function is delegated by the County Judge to the Collin County Sheriff's Office, who will prepare and maintain Annex B (Communications) to this plan and supporting SOPs.
- 2) Emergency tasks to be performed include:
  - a) Identify the communications systems available within the local area and determine the connectivity of those systems.
  - b) Develop plans and procedures for coordinated use of the various communications systems available in this jurisdiction during emergencies.
  - c) Determine and implement means of augmenting communications during emergencies, including support by volunteer organizations.

#### d. Radiological Protection

- 1) Primary responsibility for this function is assigned to the Collin County Fire Marshal's Office, who will prepare and maintain Annex D (Radiological Protection) to this plan and supporting SOPs.
- 2) Emergency tasks to be performed include:
  - a) Maintain inventory of radiological equipment.
  - b) Ensure response forces include personnel with current training in radiological monitoring and decontamination.
  - Respond to radiological incidents and terrorist incidents involving radiological materials.
  - d) Make notification concerning radiological incidents to state and federal authorities.

#### e. Evacuation

- 1) Primary responsibility for this function is delegated by the County Judge to the Collin County Sheriff's Office, who will prepare and maintain Annex E (Evacuation) to this plan and supporting SOPs.
- 2) Emergency tasks to be performed include:

- a) Identify areas where evacuation has been or may be in the future and determine population at risk.
- b) Perform evacuation planning for known risk areas to include route selection and determination of traffic control requirements specific to areas not covered by a local law enforcement agency.
- c) Develop simplified planning procedures for ad hoc evacuations.
- d) Determine emergency public information requirements.
- e) Assist in evacuation planning for special needs facilities (schools, hospitals, nursing homes, and other institutions).
- f) Perform evacuation planning for the Collin County Jail.

#### f. Firefighting

- 1) Primary responsibility for this function is delegated by the County Judge to the Collin County Fire Marshal's Office, who will prepare and maintain Annex F (Firefighting) to this plan and supporting SOPs.
- 2) Emergency tasks to be performed include:
  - a) Fire prevention activities.
  - b) Fire detection and control.
  - c) Assist with terrorist incident response.
  - d) Evacuation support.
  - e) Post-incident reconnaissance and initial damage assessment.
  - f) Fire safety inspection of temporary shelters, as required by law.
  - g) Prepare and maintain countywide fire resource inventory.

#### g. Law Enforcement

- 1) Primary responsibility for this function is delegated by the County Judge to the Collin County Sheriff's Office, who will prepare and maintain Annex G (Law Enforcement) to this plan and supporting SOPs.
- 2) Emergency tasks to be performed include:
  - a) Maintenance of law and order.
  - b) Traffic control.
  - c) Terrorist incident response.
  - d) Coordinate with state and federal partners in terrorist response and investigations
  - e) Provision of security for vital facilities, evacuated areas, and shelters.
  - f) Access control for damaged or contaminated areas.
  - g) Warning support.
  - h) Assist with post-incident reconnaissance and damage assessment.
  - i) Prepare and maintain law enforcement resource inventory.

#### h. Health and Medical Services

1) Primary responsibility for this function is delegated by the County Judge to Collin County Healthcare Services, who will prepare and maintain Annex H (Health & Medical Services) to this plan and supporting SOPs.

#### 2) Emergency tasks to be performed include:

- a) Coordinate health and medical care support during emergency situations.
- b) Public health information and education.
- c) Inspection of food and water supplies.
- d) Develop emergency public health regulations and orders.
- e) Coordinate collection, identification, and interment of deceased victims.
- f) Assist with medical support teams during shelter operations, as requested.

#### i. Direction and Control

- 1) Primary responsibility for this plan is delegated by the County Judge to Emergency Management who will prepare and maintain Annex N (Direction & Control) to this plan and supporting SOPs.
- 2) Emergency tasks to be performed include:
  - a) Direct and control our local operating forces.
  - b) Maintain coordination with neighboring jurisdictions and the Disaster District in Garland, Texas.
  - c) Maintain the EOC in an operating mode or be able to convert the designated facility space into an operable EOC rapidly.
  - d) Assign representatives to report to the EOC and develop procedures for EOC operations.
  - e) Develop and identify the duties of the staff, use of displays and message forms, and procedures for EOC activation.
  - f) Coordinate the evacuation of areas at risk.

#### j. Hazardous Materials & Oil Spill

- 1) Primary responsibility for this function is delegated by the County Judge to the Fire Marshal's Office, who will prepare and maintain Annex Q (Hazardous Material & Oil Spill Response) to this plan and supporting SOPs.
- 2) Emergency tasks to be performed include:
  - a) In accordance with OSHA regulations, establish ICS to manage the response to hazardous materials incidents.
  - b) Establish the HAZMAT incident functional areas (e.g., hot zone, warm zone, cold zone, etc.)
  - c) Initiate appropriate actions to control and eliminate the hazard in accordance with established HAZMAT response guidance and SOPs.
  - d) Determine areas at risk and which public protective actions, if any, should be implemented.
  - e) Apply appropriate firefighting techniques if the incident has, or may, result in a fire.
  - f) Determine when affected areas may be safely re-entered.

#### k. Search & Rescue

- 1) Primary responsibility for this function is delegated by the County Judge to the Collin County Fire Marshal's Office, who will prepare and maintain Annex R (Search and Rescue) to this plan and supporting SOPs.
- 2) Emergency tasks to be performed include:
  - a) Coordinate and conduct search and rescue activities.
  - b) Identify requirements for specialized resources to support rescue operations.
  - c) Coordinate external technical assistance and equipment support for search and rescue operations.

### 1. Terrorist Incident Response

- 1) Primary responsibility for this function is delegated by the County Judge to the Collin County Sheriff's Office, who will prepare and maintain Annex V (Terrorist Incident Response) to this plan and supporting SOPs.
- 2) Emergency tasks to be performed include:
  - a) Coordinate and carry out protective anti-terrorist activities, including criminal intelligence, investigation, protection of facilities, and public awareness activities.
  - b) Coordinate and carry out offensive counter-terrorist operations to neutralize terrorist activities.
  - c) Carry out terrorism consequence operations conducted in the aftermath of a terrorist incident to save lives and protect public and private property.
  - d) Ensure required notification of terrorist incidents is made to state and federal authorities.

### 6. Support Services Responsibilities

- a. Shelter and Mass Care
  - 1) Primary responsibility for this plan is delegated by the County Judge to Collin County Healthcare Services, who will be responsible for conducting annual reviews of Annex C (Shelter and Mass Care) to this plan and supporting SOPs.
  - 2) Emergency tasks to be performed include:
    - a) Perform emergency shelter and mass care planning.
    - b) Coordinate and conduct shelter and mass care operations with our other departments, relief agencies, and volunteer groups.

### b. Public Information

- 1) Primary responsibility for this function is delegated by the County Judge to the Collin County Public Information Officer, who will prepare and maintain Annex I (Emergency Public Information) to this plan and supporting SOPs.
- 2) Emergency tasks to be performed include:
  - a) Establish a Joint Information Center (JIC), if required.

- b) Coordinate with Emergency Management in conducting on-going hazard awareness and public education programs.
- e) Pursuant to the Joint Information System (JIS), compile and release information and instructions for the public during emergency situations and respond to questions relating to emergency operations.
- d) Provide information to the media and the public during emergency situations.
- e) Arrange for media briefings.
- t) Compile print and photo documentation of emergency situations.
- g) Coordinate with PIOs from impacted jurisdictions included in this EOP.

### c. Recovery

- 1) Primary responsibility for this function is delegated by the County Judge to the Collin County Public Works Department, who will prepare and maintain Annex J (Recovery) to this plan and supporting SOPs.
- 2) Emergency tasks to be performed include:
  - a) Establish and train a damage assessment team using local personnel, specific to county property and infrastructure. Coordinate the efforts of that team with state and federal damage assessment personnel who may perform a Preliminary Damage Assessment (PDA) as part of the federal disaster declaration process.
  - b) Assess and compile information on damage to public property.
  - c) Work with other organizations to compile needs and carry out program to fill those needs.
  - d) If damages are beyond our capability to deal with, compile information for use by our elected officials in requesting state or federal disaster assistance.
  - e) If we are determined to be eligible for state or federal disaster assistance, coordinate with state and federal agencies to carry out authorized recovery programs.

### d. Public Works & Engineering

- 1) Primary responsibility for this function is delegated by the County Judge to the Collin County Engineering and Public Works Department, who will prepare and maintain Annex K (Public Works & Engineering) to this plan and supporting SOPs.
- 2) Emergency tasks to be performed include:
  - a) Protect government facilities and vital equipment where possible.
  - b) Assess damage to streets, bridges, traffic control devices, and other public facilities.
  - c) Direct temporary repair of vital facilities.
  - d) Restore damaged roads and bridges.
  - e) Restore waste treatment and disposal systems, county owned and/or maintained systems.
  - f) Arrange for debris removal.
  - g) General damage assessment support.
  - h) Building inspection support.
  - i) Provide specialized equipment to support emergency operations.
  - j) Support traffic control and search and rescue operations.

### e. Utilities

- 1) Primary responsibility for this function is delegated by the County Judge to the Collin County Public Works Department, who will prepare and maintain Annex L (Energy and Utilities) to this plan and supporting SOPs.
- 2) Emergency tasks to be performed include:
  - a) Prioritize restoration of utility service to vital facilities and other facilities.
  - b) Arrange for the provision of emergency power sources where required.
  - c) Identify requirements for emergency drinking water and portable toilets to the department or agency responsible for mass care, for Collin County mass care operations.
  - d) Assess damage to, repair, and restore Collin County owned utilities.
  - e) Monitor recovery activities of privately owned utilities.

### f. Resource Management

- 1) Primary responsibility for this function is delegated by the County Judge to the Collin County Public Works Department, who will prepare and maintain Annex M (Resource Management) to this plan and supporting SOPs
- 2) Emergency tasks to be performed include:
  - a) Maintain an inventory of emergency resources.
  - b) During emergency operations, locate supplies, equipment, and personnel to meet specific needs, as requested.
  - c) Maintain a list of suppliers for supplies and equipment needed immediately in the aftermath of an emergency.
  - d) In coordination with Purchasing, establish emergency purchasing procedures and coordinate emergency procurements that meet local, state, and federal requirements.
  - e) Establish and maintain a manpower reserve and coordinate assignment of reserve personnel to departments and agencies that require augmentation.
  - f) Coordinate transportation, sorting, temporary storage, and distribution of resources during emergency situations.
  - g) Establish staging areas for resources, if required.

### g. Human Services

- Primary responsibility for this plan is delegated by the County Judge to the Collin County Healthcare Services, who will prepare and maintain Annex O (Human Services) to this plan and supporting SOPs
- 2) Emergency tasks, in coordination with Volunteer Organizations Active in Disaster, to be performed include:
  - a) Identify emergency feeding sites.
  - b) Identify sources of clothing for disaster victims.
  - c) Secure emergency food supplies.
  - d) Coordinate the operation of shelter facilities, whether operated by local government, local volunteer groups, or organized disaster relief agencies.

- e) Coordinate special care requirements for disaster victims such as the aged, special needs individuals, and others.
- f) Coordinate the provision of disaster mental health services to disaster victims, emergency workers, and/or others suffering trauma due to the emergency incident/disaster.

### h. Hazard Mitigation

- 1) Primary responsibility for this function is delegated by the County Judge to the Collin County Engineering Department, who will prepare and maintain Annex P (Hazard Mitigation) to this plan and supporting SOPs.
- 2) Emergency tasks to be performed include:
  - a) Maintain the local Hazard Analysis.
  - b) Maintain a local Hazard Mitigation Action Plan (HazMap)
  - c) Identify beneficial pre-disaster hazard mitigation projects and seek approval from local officials to implement such projects.
  - d) In the aftermath of an emergency, determine appropriate actions to mitigate the situation and coordinate implementation of those actions.
  - e) Coordinate and carry out post-disaster hazard mitigation program.

### i. Transportation

- 1) Primary responsibility for this function is delegated by the County Judge to the Collin County Public Works Department, who will prepare and maintain Annex S (Transportation) to this plan and supporting SOPs.
- 2) Emergency tasks to be performed include:
  - a) Identify local public and private transportation resources and coordinate their use in emergencies.
  - b) Coordinate deployment of transportation equipment to support emergency operations.
  - c) Establish and maintain a reserve pool of drivers, maintenance personnel, parts, and tools.
  - d) Maintain records on use of transportation equipment and personnel for purpose of possible reimbursement.

### j. Donations Management

- 1) Primary responsibility for this function is delegated by the County Judge to the Collin County Auditor's Office, who will prepare and maintain Annex T (Donations Management) to this plan and supporting SOPs.
- 2) Emergency tasks to be performed include:
  - a) Compile resource known resource needs.
  - b) Solicit donations to meet known needs, if needs exist.
  - c) Establish and implement procedures to receive, accept or turn down offers of donated goods and services, and provide instructions to donors of needed goods or services.

- d) In coordination with the Resource Management staff, establish a facility to receive, sort, and distribute donated goods, if needed.
- e) Coordinate with Human Services and others in ensuring donated supplies are managed from receiving through distribution.
- f) Consider coordinating with an external agency to manage donation operations.

### k. Legal

- 1) Primary responsibility for this function is delegated by the County Judge to the Collin County District Attorney's Office, who will prepare and maintain Annex U (Legal) to this plan and supporting SOPs.
- 2) Emergency tasks to be performed include:
  - a) Advise local officials on emergency powers of local government and procedures for invoking those measures.
  - b) Review and advise our officials on possible legal issues arising from disaster operations.
  - c) Prepare and/or recommend legislation to implement the emergency powers that may be required during an emergency.
  - d) Advise local officials and department heads on record-keeping requirements and other documentation necessary for the exercising of emergency powers.
- 1. Department and agency heads not assigned a specific function in this plan will be prepared to make their resources available for emergency duty at the direction of our chief elected official.

### 7. Volunteer Support Services Responsibilities

The following are local volunteer agencies that can provide disaster relief services and traditionally have coordinated their efforts with our local government:

### a. American Red Cross

Provides shelter management, feeding at fixed facilities and through mobile units, first aid, replacement of eyeglasses and medications, provision of basic clothing, and limited financial assistance to those affected by emergency situations. The Red Cross also provides feeding for emergency workers.

### b. The Salvation Army

Provides emergency assistance to include mass and mobile feeding, counseling, missing person services, medical assistance, and the warehousing and distribution of donated goods including food, clothing, and household items. It also provides referrals to government and private agencies for special services.

### c. Southern Baptist Convention Disaster Relief

Provides mobile feeding units staffed by volunteers. Active in providing disaster childcare, the agency has several mobile childcare units. Can also assist with clean-up activities, feeding, temporary repairs, reconstruction, counseling, and bilingual services.

### d. Amateur Emergency Radio Services

The Radio Amateur Civil Emergency Service provides amateur radio support for emergency operations, including communications support in the EOC.

### e. Collin County VOAD

Provides coordination of volunteer and corporate partners in the community for disaster response and recovery. Performs hazard mitigation and preparedness activities in coordination with local government.

### f. Citizen Corp Program

- 1) Collin County Medical Reserve Corps (MRC)
- 2) City's Community Emergency Response Teams (CERT)
- 3) Collin County Sheriff's Office Citizens on Patrol (COP)
- 4) City's Citizens on Patrol (COP)
- 5) City's Fire Corp

These programs are managed locally in Collin County by both the county and local cities depending on the program. These programs provide training to citizen volunteers to assist local first responders and governments before, during, and after major emergencies or disasters. The MRC specializes in medical assistance and can assist with medical Points of Distribution (PODs), with medical operations in shelters, and other medical related tasks. The COPs, both county run and locally run, can assist with law enforcement activities, including traffic control, crowd monitoring, and other law enforcement type duties. The Fire Corp, can assist with fire department's public education and rehabilitation of first responders. Finally the CERTs are all hazards and can assist with a wide range of duties including damage assessment, shelter operations, and search and rescue, among others.

Provides medical and non-medical volunteers to support the deployment of the Strategic National Stockpile and other missions at the request of the Collin County Health Care Services.

### VII. DIRECTION AND CONTROL

### A. General

- 1. The County Judge is responsible for establishing objectives and policies for emergency management and providing general guidance for disaster response and recovery operations, all in compliance with NIMS, at the County. Each city establishes objectives and policies for their jurisdiction within their city's legal framework. During disasters, the County Judge may carry out those responsibilities from the EOC. Mayors may fulfill their duties from their respective EOCs.
- 2. The EMC will provide overall direction of the response activities of all involved county departments. During major emergencies and disasters, the EMC will normally carry out those responsibilities from the County EOC.
- 3. The Emergency Management Coordinator, or designee, will manage the EOC.

### REGULATORY UPDATE

No new orders have been issued by Governor Abbott since April 6, 2021. Additionally, the Governor's Office website contains a TDEM <a href="link to testing locations">link to testing locations</a> and a TSHS <a href="link with vaccination information">link with vaccination information</a>.

From the federal government, all cities will be entitled to a federal grant from the new *Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Fund*. The city attorney provided an analysis of this at the last meeting and is continuing to collect pertinent information. A presentation from the National League of Cities (NLC) about the federal stimulus bill is attached. The National League of Cities (NLC) has prepared a comprehensive web page with the latest information.

The City Attorney continues to monitor the Orders and commentaries to ensure that the City regulations in the form of Ordinance No. <u>2020-04-01</u> and Ordinance No. <u>2020-04-05</u> are sufficient and appropriate. The severability clauses in the city's ordinances contemplate provisions that may be precluded by updated Orders and Proclamations.
